# Archaeological field program

For five to nine weeks each summer, I train undergraduate and graduate students in archaeological field methods as part of my research in the Rio Grande del Norte National Monument near Taos, New Mexico. Prior to the field season, I assist students in the process of applying for small grants to cover their travel expenses. During the field season, I supervise them as they learn survey, mapping, and excavation techniques as well as basic in-field analysis of artifacts.
